Mission


Minimize the loss of life, personal injury, property damage and environmental impact while maximizing the safe use and enjoyment of U.S. waterways by recreational boaters. The Vessel Safety Check process is one of "prevention through education, outreach and volunteer compliance" helping recreational boaters to gain a respect for the boating environment.

The VSC Program also helps to achieve voluntary compliance with federal and state recreational boating safety laws, particularly with regard to the carriage of safety equipment while raising boater awareness about safety and environmental issues through voluntary contact by a Vessel Examiner (VE). VE discussions with recreational boaters is designed to motivate maintaining and operating their boats in a safe manner, taking boating safety courses to increase their knowledge and skills in boating, and promoting safe boating. The major courses offered to members by YSPS include:

One of the main goals of USPS is "boating safety through education" – we believe that an educated boater is a safer boater. USPS instructors who teach public courses are certified regarding their ability to teach and use modern instructional methods. USPS provides many educational opportunities to the general public through a variety of courses, seminars, and marine-related guides.

Recreational boating fatalities

Recreational boating fatalities in the States, five U. S. Territories, and the District of Columbia dropped to a record low of 676 in 2004,, and then rose slightly in 2005 to 697, according to the CG Recreational Boating Accident Report Database (BARD). The highest number of recorded boating fatalities was an incredible 1,750 in 1973, with 90% of those fatalities caused by drowning.

Many boating accidents were the result of alcohol use, and most of all boating fatalities could have been prevented by wearing personal flotation devices.

Personal watercraft deaths were down from 79 in 1995 to 54 in 1996, but then <u>rose</u> to an all time high of 84 in 1997. In 2005, there were 65 PWC fatalities, nine more than in the previous year.

In 1963, there were 33 deaths for every 100,000 boats. In 2003, there were 5.5 fatalities for each 100,000 boats.

The Coast Guard Office of Boating Safety estimates are that .24 PWC-related deaths per million hours of use. By comparison, open motorboats are responsible for .14 fatalities per million hours of use. *(continued page 7)*




