New Jersey Boating Law

New Jersey has passed Assembly No A2326 which requires that any power boater operating in New Jersey waters after June 1, 2009 shall be in possession of a boat safety certificate.

For most of us, the relevant clauses are:


A NJ resident must have completed an approved NJ boat safety course.

An out of state resident, or a resident of a foreign country who is 16 years of age or older and who will be in the state for less than 90 days may operate a power boat in NJ without having completed a NJ safe boating course provided that:

- Written proof of successful completion of a boat safety course approved by another state, the National Association of Boating Law Administration or its successor organization, or the US Coast Guard,
- Written proof of successful completion of a boat safety course substantially similar to the NJ course
- A boat safety course issued by the state or country in which the person resides.

So if you want to travel through New Jersey in 2009, you will need to have a safe boating certificate, regardless of whether your own state requires it or not.

Travelogue

The Golden Gate Bridge is a suspension bridge spanning the opening of the San Francisco Bay onto the Pacific Ocean. The Golden Gate Bridge was the longest suspension bridge in the world when it was completed in 1937. It is 8,981 feet long, 90 feet wide and has a clearance below of 220 feet at mean higher high water.

The Golden Gate is a narrow, 400 foot deep strait that serves as the mouth of San Francisco Bay. Crossing the bay by boat is dangerous due to natural obstacles of strong winds, a diurnal tide and tidal current that can exceed 4.5 knots. Ferry service began as early as 1820 between San Francisco and Marin County to the north and lasted until the 20th century when San Francisco was the largest city still served primarily by ferry boats. In 1916, an engineer named Strauss responded to a San Francisco Bulletin article questioning whether a bridge could be built for less than \$100 million. After several decades of work, many design changes, and financial difficulties following the Wall Street collapse of 1929, construction on the bridge began on 5 January 1933.

Construction was completed by April 1937 and the project cost \$1.3 million less than budget. The color of *international orange* was selected by the architect to blend in with the natural surroundings and enhance the bridge's visibility in the frequent fog. The bridge is being painted somewhere all the time.

Kathy and I took the opportunity to visit 2nd Lt. Miller, RN over the Christmas holiday and walk the bridge along with other touristy activities. She sends her regards.
